There has, quite likely, never been a Canadian natural gas project as eagerly awaited as a west coast LNG terminal - ANY west coast LNG terminal.

As recently as 2014, no less than 20 projects were being proposed. Since then, however, one after another have fallen by the wayside, and today, only four - LNG Canada and Kitimat LNG (a project of Chevron and Australia's Woodside) in Kitimat, Woodfibre LNG in Squamish, and Kwispaa LNG on Vancouver Island - can be considered still active on the list. And those projects still face barriers to construction.

The LNG market is expected to continue to grow, providing Canada with an opportunity to help offset the decrease in the natural gas export market to the US with another potential customer base.

CERI analyzed and compared Canada's projects in British Columbia and Nova Scotia with counterparts in the US Gulf of Mexico (Texas and Louisiana) and Australia.

Attendees will hear from Allan Fogwill, President & CEO, CERI, who will provide an executive overview of this most recent CERI study and take questions from the audience.
